"How sweet your words taste to me; they are sweeter than honey." Psalms 119:103 NLT

Such simple, yet profound truths. I'm not an expert in ancient sweeteners, but I would guess that refined sugars weren't a part of their diet in the Psalmist's day. What did they use for natural additives? And, it's not too far of a stretch to remember that bees had to be carefully cultivated and their honey harvested. Sweet things have always been and will always be a treat! Here, the Psalmist compares God's word to a favorite sweetener and in that captures his natural love for both honey and what it's like to read, meditate and process God's commands on a regular basis. He sees it like a dessert, like I see Hagan Das double chocolate chip ice cream. A couple of verses later he compare God's word to a flashlight - that works too.
