#### [lectio] // JOB 9:1-11

listen to the text by reading out loud slowly and repeat up to 3x if desired

### [meditatio]

reflect on – what word, words, phrase, or sentence speaks to you from the text, then write them down

It is one thing for a human to trust God, to completely and wholly accept everything he does as good, right, just and perfect. It is a very different thing for God to trust a human and to believe that the bond between creator and created will not be broken no matter what that human experiences. God trusted a human male, he trusted that Job could not be convinced to break trust or deny truth that God is always good and right. Job could be trusted with a fierce loyalty that could only come from a deep love for his creator. That love was not forced on him, nor in him. Job wasn't preprogrammed or predetermined to love God, he choose to do so out of years of knowing God even with his limited understanding of God's plans or purpose. This wasn't a test of Job's faith, it was a test of God's plan of creating humans that could truly love him, not for what He does for them, but purely an unselfish act.

#### [oratio]

pray as responding to the words, phrase, sentence that God has stirred within you
