Jeremiah buys a field. I've heard stories about this purchase (and others). He buys it just before Babylon takes over the city, which makes the field purchase useless. But is it useless? There are so many things that do not make sense because we do not see the whole picture, and we only have these moments that make up "our" life. God is eternal and his plans are eternal. So God allows us to participate in plans and stories that pre and post date our personal timeline. God knew when Babylon would take the city and he knew when Israel would get it back. Then, the deed to the land would become valid again. I don't have time today, but I really wonder where that plot of land was and is today - and better yet, what was it for? Was it later golgotha? Or Jesus temporary burial place? Or part of the future temple mount? Was it where Abraham was asked to give up his son, Issac? God had purpose for the plot and he wanted Jeremiah to be a part of a big plan for the future!
