Wisdom Sayings

- 1. Don't rob the poor just because you can, or exploit the needy in court.
- 2. Don't befriend angry people or associate with hottempered people,
- 3. Don't agree to guarantee another person's debt or put up security for someone else.
- 4. Don't cheat your neighbor by moving the ancient boundary markers set up by previous generations.
- 5. Do you see any truly competent workers? They will serve kings rather than working for ordinary people.
- 6. Don't envy evil people or desire their company.
- 7. A house is built by wisdom and becomes strong through good sense.
- 8. The wise are mightier than the strong, and those with knowledge grow stronger and stronger.
- 9. Wisdom is too lofty for fools. Among leaders at the city gate, they have nothing to say.
- 10. A person who plans evil will get a reputation as a troublemaker.
- 11. If you fail under pressure, your strength is too small.
- 12. Rescue those who are unjustly sentenced to die; save them as they stagger to their death. Don't excuse yourself by saying, "Look, we didn't know." For God understands all hearts, and he sees you. He who guards your soul knows you knew. He will repay all people as their actions deserve.
