reflect on – what word, words, phrase, or sentence speaks to you from the text, then write them down

The world would never know him through human wisdom. Paul does not say that those who believe are simpletons, just that faith is not the same as "proof." Human wisdom says, one doesn't die to save! Human wisdom says, God does not become man and live, suffer and go to a criminal's cross. God's wisdom is truth through extreme love, sacrifice and forgiveness. Human wisdom still can't figure out forgiveness! We only know retribution, retaliation and violence to solve issues.

[oratio]

pray as responding to the words, phrase, sentence that God has stirred within you
