She had a hard time figuring out WHY people would do wrong! Especially with things as basic as lying, stealing or damaging others property. I would get quite a severe glare when I told her that I used to "enjoy" it or never felt guilty and that I can relate to youth who think similarly. I know how creepy that makes me sound, but I'm just being honest. Robin had the hardest time wondering why people purposely sinned at all! She felt like she could understand or even justify "accidental" sins or sins of omission, as our Catholic friends would say. But direct sins of commission? No way. I'd like to think that God transformed my life in such a way that I did not continue my nefarious ways, and for sure didn't pass on such deplorable acts (as acceptable) to our children. So our adult kids DO have a certain crown of grace and chain of honor - it is now part of the Garvin "code."
