Since the "old system" was only a shadow, was it just the sacrifice or the totality of what we know as the "law." There are ten commandments, but hundreds of rules and regs about maintaining purity before a Holy God. Were ALL of those fulfilled under Christ work on the cross? I believe Jesus introduced the New Covenant as a the complete picture of what God intended all along, the old passed and it has been made new. There are so many details of the "old" that are referenced and made to sound like they MUST be obeyed even today. The New Testament believers struggled with a few (circumcision, eating certain foods), but there are a lot more subtle ones that come up. Like modern day pastors behaving like old covenant priests or adherence to the sabbath as a law, not as a model. Or even some areas of tithing. I think, "if Christ fulfilled the law, he did so completely," so we should now live as a son, a child, a friend and obedience should flow out of relationship, not rules given as a instructional for an object lesson in the future.
