So, let me get this straight. Israelites are complainers, whiners and negative. Is it generic? Maybe. Is it cultural? Probably. Look at what they had been through - 400 years of slavery, I'd be pretty negative if I were, and all my grandparents were slaves. But now they are free, but they don't know how to be free. They had a hard life, but now, in many ways, it's harder - because it required something they had not developed. Faith and trust in a God. Moses is clear about one thing. God sent the snakes! God sent the snakes to kill Israelites. And, they guit complaining. Then in a shocker twist in the story, God doesn't just tell the snakes to leave. No, the snakes stay. And, they keep biting the Israelites. God's remedy, have Moses make a snake statue on a stick. The Lord said to Moses, "Make a snake and put it up on a pole; anyone who is bitten can look at it and live." You get bit, you get sick, just look at the stick! WHAT the crazy? There is so much symbolic, object lesson stuff in this story, I just don't know if I understand it all. I know that the snake represents sin, and it's deadly. I know that much later, Jesus became sin and was hung up on a stick. And, I know that all who look to him for salvation will be saved, and in this case healed. What did this object lesson mean to the people at that time, coming out of slavery, their world filled with ancient symbols of all kinds of strange statues in their former slave days.
