Well, it's sprinkling, spritzing as my mother-in-law used to say. My wife, Robin, loves the rain. She loves cloudy, overcast days. I don't. She doesn't see clouds and rain as gloomy, but rather, romantically beautiful and mysterious. This rain, that Moses wrote about was more than a few clouds or an overcast day. It was a torrential storm that lasted for over a month. Total destruction of all land life outside the ark! So God makes a promise and a contract with humankind - I won't destroy the earth again by water. As much as it might sound like mythology of gods and humans, I think about this. Science can tell me how rainbows form and when they form, but not necessarily WHY they form.
