By God, by friends, by family - "go and lead!" they'd suggest. I am a RELUCTANT leader. People hate that I say that. "It sounds so negative, so fatalistic," they say. People say, "I'm my worst enemy," or "I'm harder on myself." That's what the proverb is saying.
