

## lectio // Psalm 97

In this entire chapter, the Psalmist focuses on the brilliant and fierce nature of God and his placement above all other false gods. But near the end of this passage, there is this little, beautiful encouragement, a reminder of hope for those who know God. Light and Joy. My favorite day of the year is not Christmas, July 4th or my birthday. It's the longest day of sunshine every year - June 21st.
