## lectio // Mark 10:32-45

You know. Jesus said the disciples knew and you know as well. Rulers and officials LORD and FLAUNT. It's always been true, it will always be true - this is a human frailty, lording and flaunting. But YOU MUST BE DIFFERENT! You want to be a leader, you MUST be a servant. You want to be first, be a SLAVE. A great book by Simon Sinek, Leaders Eat Last. Jesus came not to be served, but to serve. Why is this so hard to not only understand, but to practice. One: lording and flaunting; authority and attention are addictive. Two: humans want strength, not mercy in their leaders. They want King Sauls'. Is service seen as weakness? Is humility seen as flawed? You know what rulers and officials are like. You also know what you think you want in a leader - ruthlessness towards others, kindness towards you. Come on admit it, you know it's true.
