I wasn't outwardly rude to adults, because that would draw too much attention, I was cunning and quiet. By the time I was fifteen, I lacked everything this book of Proverbs talked about. But until the moment God offered me something no human had been able to give me, I was a walking waste of space. One decision to yield to God's offer and the hardest part of my story was just beginning - wisdom, discipline and discernment were painfully, slowly confronting my emptiness. And I wanted to be taught and mentored by God!
