## lectio // Matthew 2

How can you NOT love this story? It is filled with drama, mystery and intrigue. And, this idea of the Magi financing the young couple's ability to move and survive in Egypt, for THREE years is a miracle. And we're talking about 105+ mile journey to eventually return to Nazareth. So, I can't help but think of the Magi as being the "Delighted Donors." Look at the trouble they (rich members of one of Parthia's two ruling classes who were willing to travel over 1,000 miles to worship) went through to come and pay homage and give anywhere from \$4 million to possibly \$120 million (today's dollars). There are even some researchers that believe this money allowed Mary to raise a large family, after Joseph died, and finance Jesus' entire ministry for three years! So many times I forget that God supplies supernatural means to accomplish his plans. And these plans had been put into place thousands of years (really eternally) earlier. Lack of money is NOT the reason a good plan doesn't get fulfilled. We just have to make sure it's God's plan and not solely ours ...
