Zechariah gives this tender, beautiful, prophetic word over John, his son. After not being able to speak for 9 months, because he had arrogant doubts about Gabriel's words to him in the temple, Zach not only begins to speak powerful words of redemption, but he also speaks over his son - about this role he will play in preparing the way for the messiah. "You my little son," is so adorable and tender. You feel the deep connection, not just as a father but also a very long fulfillment to a promise. There has been a lot of talk about the Father's blessing over their children OR really the lack of the Father's blessing. Can you see how this entire journey with Zechariah has re-formed his entire theology, his entire foundation of faith? NOW he sees, NOW he believes and NOW he speaks over his son's future, "You will be..." Wow. Imagine the power, in our your family, of a dad with that kind of relationship with God and that kind of authority to speak over their children's lives. Imagine the power of a transformed life, like Zach, speaking over the children in his community as well. When you have this authentic encounter with God, it gives you the STRENGTH TO SPEAK blessing and a future of hope and light. His words to his own son became a path, a purpose for John where one day he would "tell his people how to find salvation through forgiveness of their sins!" And John would baptize Jesus, the son of the living God, in the Jordan river. Wow. Amazing!
