## lectio 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

Thank you Paul! So, what gift has the Holy Spirit given you? Paul writes, they are all from God (one Spirit), but distributed differently to each of us. "He alone decides which gift each person should have." What a profound thought, everyone is given something to help, someway to give and participate in this "now, not yet" future called the Kingdom of God. I know so many people that don't believe they have ANYTHING to offer. Maybe they feel invisible, like I did, or feel unworthy, or shy, they're an introvert. I'm really kinda sick of the boxed-in excuse laden label of "introvert!" "I'm just not a people person," is said. For one, there are gifts custom designed for introverts. Gifts of service, administration, intercession, mercy and helps are just a few. However, sooner or later people have to be involved because that's the part of "each other" Paul refers to. The spiritual body of Christ is made up of many parts, but NONE of them operate independant or outside of the body. It is ultimately about cooperation and unity that makes a body function properly. If you are a believer in Jesus, a follower of the way, then you are a part of the body and a significant part of a local expression of community.
