lectio // Proverbs 16:1-3,9

I promise you, this verse, along with similar "We can make our own plans, but the Lord gives the right answer." And, "We can make our plans, but the Lord determines our steps," 16:1, 9, have guided my life for a very long time. These verses gave me the NEVER QUIT, KEEP MOVING FORWARD determinism I needed to build the framework of faith for my life!
